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Marcus Pietsch is a DFG Heisenberg Professor of Educational Management and Quality Development and Dean of Research in the Faculty of Education at the University of Lüneburg, Germany. Since 2021, his professorship has been funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG) in recognition of his outstanding research achievements, allowing him to focus on topics in quantitative school leadership research.

Previously, he worked for various national and international organizations, including the Institute for Educational Monitoring (IfBQ), Hamburg, the Center for International Student Assessment (ZIB), Kiel, the Institute for Quality Improvement in Education (IQB), Berlin, and the International Association for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement (IEA), Hamburg and Amsterdam.









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He leads a number of research projects for research councils, foundations and governments at local, national and international levels, is a host of the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation (AvH), an active member of the Network for International Policies and Cooperation in Education and Training (NORRAG), and is involved in The World Academy of Sciences for the Advancement Science Developing Countries (TWAS) of of UNESCO.

His current research focuses on school leadership and innovation in education and international comparative studies of leadership and innovation and change in schools. He is particularly interested in new and under-researched theoretical concepts models, e.g. ambidexterity, and methods, e.g. IPD meta-analyses and machine learning.
