Advanced

- converse about some topics but cannot sustain verbal interactions; exhibit frequent hesitations and errors in pronunciation, grammar, and vocabulary that may sometimes impede the expression of meaning
- use a limited range of vocabulary, phrases, or memorized statements and structures in English
- communicate and speak about general or familiar topics relying on slow speech or hesitation; longer pauses occur when discussing academic or uncommon topics, and the pronunciation may not be very clear
- produce short answers to general topics with a limited range of lexical resource, but ideas may not be clear at times; basic syntactic structures are used, and though more complex structures are attempted, these generally contain errors and lapses
- express some ideas but in an inaccurate or insufficient manner. There may be incoherence in longer stretches of speech, especially when discussing more complex topics

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- converse about simple topics but cannot sustain verbal interactions; exhibit quite frequent hesitations and errors in pronunciation, grammar, and vocabulary that impede the expression of meaning
- use a very limited range of vocabulary, phrases, or memorized statements and structures in English
- communicate limited information about everyday or familiar topics in slow, intermittent speech with pauses and hesitation
- speech may not be understood at times due to mispronunciations
- produce short answers with a very limited range of grammatical resources; simple structures predominate
- express some limited ideas about everyday topics, but main points and specific information are inadequate or not presented
