Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree in Educational Technology or a related discipline, along with at least one year of post-graduate full-time work experience. Alternatively, candidates with a Master's degree are also eligible to apply. Applicants should be adept at multi-tasking, working under tight deadlines and being able to work both independently and as a team. Additionally, they should possess exceptional written English skills, particularly in academic writing. Having knowledge and experience in website construction and maintenance will be an advantage.
