Project Title: Homogeneities among children with neurodevelopmental disorders: A transdiagnostic approach

The Department of Special Education and Counselling is seeking a qualified and highly dedicated person to provide research support to a project aiming at studying homogeneities among children with neurodevelopmental disorders. He/she will be responsible for preparing and managing the project and relevant research studies, recruiting participants, collecting and analyzing data, and any other research-related tasks assigned by the supervisor. The initial appointment will be for a period of 12 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree or above, preferably in developmental and/or educational psychology or related disciplines with evidence of related research experience. Priority will be given to candidates with sophisticated knowledge and research training/experience on neurodevelopmental disorder/specific learning disabilities (SpLD), such as dyslexia, dyscalculia, ADHD, ASD, etc., and relevant measures and quantitative analysis methods (particularly machine learning) in the field of psychology, or related disciplines. They should be proficient in both English and Chinese (Cantonese) in reading and writing. They should be self-motivated, willing to work in a team, and able to work under tight timelines.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
