The appointee will be responsible for providing program and administrative support to the Student Affairs Office. Major duties include providing support for student development programmes and student-led projects, such as workshops, training, and conferences; coordinating surveys and managing data; drafting documents and promotional materials; liaising with internal and external parties and students at large; and performing any other duties as assigned by supervisors.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably with relevant full-time working experience. They should possess good interpersonal and communication skills, be passionate about working with university students, be attentive to details and the ability to work independently and as a team member. Additionally, proficiency in both English and Chinese (including Putonghua) and computer literacy are required. Having hands-on experience in organizing events and activities, as well as using Canva, Photoshop and Adobe Illustrator, will be advantageous. Occasion working outside normal office hours may be required.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include the University's Voluntary Contributions to MPF Scheme or a contract-end lump sum payment (totaling up to 10% of the basic salary), leave, medical and dental benefits.
