Applicants are preferred to have experience and be proficient in handling children with special education needs. Applicants should have high proficiency in English and Cantonese and exhibit strong interpersonal and communication skills, enabling them to collaborate with interdisciplinary teams. The successful candidate will be detail-oriented, self-motivated, and able to work independently in a fast-paced environment.
