Key responsibilities include conducting literature reviews on AI-enabled Generative Tools and Course Assessments, current status, good practices and future directions, collecting and analysing relevant information/data for the project from departments of the Faculty, preparing research reports and deliverables, providing administrative and logistic support for the project.

Applicants should have (i) a Bachelor's degree or above, preferably in the area of education or related areas; (ii) Good interpersonal and communication skills; (iii) Proficiency in both written and spoken English and Chinese. The appointee should be self-motivated, able to work under pressure with multiple deadlines, and, after normal office hours, able to work independently and to work as a team member. Applicants with academic background and research experience in the fields of education and /or working experience in project management would be preferable.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
