Major duties include (a) assisting the project team in producing, revising and promoting the learning and teaching materials for primary and secondary schools, (b) conducting data collection, data management, statistical analysis, (c) liaising with primary and secondary schools, organizing tryout workshops, focus group meetings and learning activities; (d) preparing reports for the project; (e) follow-up on the projects’ progress and post-project deliverables, e.g. liaising with academic and teaching staff on project output matters, coordinating project output dissemination and evaluation; and (f) other duties as assigned by the principal supervisors. The appointment will be for a period of around 12 months.

Applicants should have a Bachelor’s Degree in Chinese Language, Chinese Literature, Chinese Culture, Education or a related discipline with at least 3 years post-qualification working experience in tertiary institutions. Experience in project management, strong interpersonal, communication, and effective organizational skills are essential. Applicants should be highly proficient in both English and Chinese (Cantonese and Putonghua). He/ She should also be a good team player, attentive to details, highly self-motivated and able to work under strict timelines.
