

Assistant Curator (Holding a substantive rank of Library Assistant II) (Ref: 2401365) Library

The Education University of Hong Kong Library is now seeking a person with project management, research, publication, promotion and marketing experience, preferably with a background in museums, cultural heritage or education field.

The appointee will support the development and operation of the **Hong Kong Museum of Education**. Main duties include providing support to research and development of exhibition proposals; undertaking curatorial work, exhibition development and management, publications, promotion and other exhibition-related activities; coordinating acquisitions, cataloguing, storage and display of artifacts; assisting in planning and organization of educational programmes, events and activities.

Applicants should have Level 2 or equivalent or above in 5 subjects including Chinese Language, English Language and Mathematics in the HKDSE; or Grade E (Level 2) or above in at least 5 subjects including Chinese, English (Syllabus B) and Mathematics in HKCEE or equivalent. Applicants with a Bachelor's Degree relevant to Museum Studies, Arts, Culture, Education Studies, History or related fields are highly preferred. Those with several years of experience in a museum, gallery or related educational organization will be an advantage. They should be a good team player with a strong sense of responsibility and self-initiative. They are expected to have a good command of written and spoken English and Chinese (Cantonese and Putonghua); strong computer skills and good communication skills.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include the University's Voluntary Contributions to MPF Scheme or a contract-end lump sum payment (totaling up to 10% of the basic salary), leave, medical and dental benefits.
