Project Title: The Impact of Student's Mathematical Well-being on STEM Career Interest: A Comparative Study between Mainland China, Hong Kong, and Japan

[Appointment Period: around 6 months]

The appointee will be responsible for conducting research projects related to exploring the impact of students' mathematical well-being on STEM career interests, particularly in a cross-cultural context. Specific duties include preparing research materials, data collection, data coding, quantitative and qualitative data analysis, report writing, and supervising student helpers. The appointee is also expected to provide administrative support to the Principal Investigator and the research team. The appointment will be for a period of 6 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably a Master's Degree in Educational Measurement and Assessment, Curriculum and Teaching, Mathematics Education or other related fields. Applicants should be competent in academic research, proficient in statistical analyses (e.g., SPSS, R, or other data-analysis software) and good communication skills in both written and spoken English and Chinese are essential. Applicants should be self-motivated, responsible, organized, and able to work independently and in a team. Relevant research experience would be an advantage.
