The appointee will work on several research projects related to Hong Kong students' learning experience in supplementary tutoring. He/she will be required to conduct literature review, invite and liaise with participants, conduct interviews, transcribe and analyse data, supervise and coordinate full-time and part-time research assistants as well as a group of student helpers, and perform other duties assigned by the project leader. The appointment will commence on 1 January 2025 or as soon as possible thereafter until 31 December 2026.

Applicants should preferably have a Master's Degree in Education or a related field with at least two years of full-time post-graduate research work experience. They should have high proficiency in spoken Cantonese and English, good written English, and excellent communication skills. They should possess the competence to conduct data collection and analysis independently. Preference will be given to those who demonstrate a high level of initiative and self-motivation, are familiar with mixed methods research methodologies and are capable of conducting quantitative and qualitative analysis with relevant software such as SPSS, NVivo, and QDA Miner. Knowledge in education-related areas and experience in research paper publication will be an advantage.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
