The appointee will be required to provide individual psychological counselling for both undergraduate and postgraduate students; administer psychological testing services related to mood and personality; conduct workshops and organize various programmes focused on mental health and psychological wellness; arrange support services and training for student groups to enhance their adjustment and development; and offer counselling support for students in crisis.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's or Master's Degree in Counselling, Social Work, Clinical Psychology, Educational Psychology, or a related field, along with 5 or more years of post-qualification work experience, preferably in tertiary institutions or other mental health agencies working with young people. Membership in relevant professional bodies in Hong Kong or overseas is also required. They should be able to provide counselling in English, Cantonese, and Putonghua. Experience working with mainland and international students will be an advantage. Applicants with less experience may also be considered.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include leave and outpatient medical benefits.
