The appointee will be responsible for developing and implementing projects on the development of Chinese medicine in Hong Kong under Professor Stephen Wing-Kai Chiu. Duties will include analyzing large-scale qualitative and quantitative datasets, conducting interviews, organizing engagement activities in the Chinese medicine community, and help drafting reports and research manuscripts.

Applicants for Senior Research Assistantship should have a master's degree in social science or related disciplines, plus one year post master's degree full-time working experience. Experience and skills in quantitative analyses of survey data would be an advantage. Good command in both spoken and written English and Chinese (Cantonese and Putonghua) and with good communicative skills are essential. The appointee is required to work 27 hours per week and will also be occasionally required to perform duties in non-regular hours.
