We are seeking two Research Assistants II/I (full-time) to provide support for a research project relating to AI, decision-making, and mouse tracking. The successful candidate will be involved in a range of research tasks including data cleaning, data analysis (e.g., Stata), literature review, writing academic papers, and fulfilling other research-related duties as assigned. There will be opportunities for manuscript writing and publication in international journals. The appointment will be for around 5 to 6 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have (i) a Bachelor's degree or above, preferably in the areas of Public Administration, Political Science, or a related field of social sciences; (ii) Experience in quantitative research methods; (iii) Excellent interpersonal and communication skills; (iv) Proficiency in written English. Preference will be given to those with research experience. Applicants with less research-related experience may be considered for the post of Research Assistant II.
