Their duties include data collection and analysis, providing technical and clerical support to the Principal Investigator, and any other duties as assigned. Applicants should have Bachelor's Degree, preferably with a Master's Degree in Linguistics, with good research experience in experimental phonetics. Those well-versed in PRAAT and statistics are preferred. Experience in using ultrasound for phonetics research would be an advantage. An excellent command of Cantonese, English, and Mandarin is required.
