Project Title: A novel conditioning approach to counter loneliness in adults

The appointee will work on projects related to loneliness, socio-affective processing and brain health. He/she will support the research team in planning and conducting the project activities. The appointee will conduct literature review and prepare assessment materials. He/she will help with the collection of behavioural and neuroimaging data (e.g., MRI), data entry, data management and data analysis. The appointee will also assist in manuscript writing and any other duties as assigned. He/she may have to travel to other institutions.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology, Cognitive neuroscience, or a related discipline. They should have a good command of written and spoken English and Chinese (including Cantonese); basic knowledge in using statistical software such as SPSS and R; be self-motivated, responsible, and able to work independently and as a team. Experience with programming (e.g., E-Prime, MATLAB) and/or cognitive neuroscience methods (e.g., MRI, EEG, tDCS, TMS) will be an asset.
