Project Title: Data Sharing and Protection: A Comparative Study of Hong Kong and Different

The appointee will be responsible for providing research support for a project relating to data laws. This includes conducting literature reviews, collecting data, particularly from electronic databases regarding policy and legislation, analyzing existing Hong Kong laws in comparison with UK, US, and European regulations, and preparing reports. The appointee will also involves preparing reports, managing project logistics, and assisting in organizing conferences. The appointment will be for a period of 12 months with the possibility of renewal subject to agreement.

Applicants should have at least a Master Degree of Law plus one year's post Master's degree full-time working experience, preferably with a doctorate in Law. They should also familiar with domestic and international digital legislation and have the ability to conduct research in both Chinese and English. Strong written and spoken communication skills in English and Chinese (Cantonese and Putonghua) are essential. They should also be a good team player, attentive to details, highly self-motivated, and able to work under pressure. Immediate availability is preferred.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
