The Department of Early Childhood Education is inviting applications for the position of Research Assistant I for the project "Comprehensive support for families during the transition to primary school".

The appointee will provide research and administrative support to the project. The appointee will be responsible for reviewing the literature, collecting data, analysing data, and drafting reports. The appointee will also coordinate activities facilitating the dissemination of research findings, and perform other duties as assigned by the Principal Investigator. The appointment will be for a period of 9 months with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree in Psychology, Education, or other related disciplines. He/She should be highly responsible, intrinsically motivated, and able to work independently. Applicants should also have strong interpersonal communication and analytical skills, and high proficiency in both written and spoken Chinese and English. Applicants with a master's degree of relevant disciplines, proficiency in Cantonese, strong PC skills (MS Office), and knowledge of statistical software (e.g., SPSS, Mplus, R) will be preferable.
