The appointee will provide research support for "Chemical Analysis and Environmental Health". Depending on the research needs, the appointee needs to work frequently in field sampling and/or other venues scattered in Hong Kong, which may also be occasionally offered after normal office hours (e.g. evenings or weekends). The appointee will also support any other duties as assigned by supervising officers. The appointees are expected to commence employment as soon as possible.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably with some post-qualification working experience and interest in event management. They should be meticulous and be able to work independently or as a team member with flexibility. They should have good interpersonal and communication skills with a good work attitude even under pressure. They should be proficient in written and spoken English, Chinese, and general computer applications. Applicants with event management and/or administrative working experience in tertiary institutions will be an advantage. Experience in chemical analysis and/or publication is also desired.
