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## What is Positive Psychology?

- **Positive psychology** is the scientific study of positive subjective experiences, positive individual traits, and positive institutions that promote quality of life and prevent pathologies from occurring.

## What is Positive Education?

- **Positive education** is an approach that integrates evidence-based means of promoting character, life skills, and well-being with traditional education principles for academic learning.



# Special Features of MA(PPE)

- **One of the first in Hong Kong** to address the interplay between positive psychology and positive education
- **One of the first in Asia** to provide training in positive psychology and positive education
- Emphasises the **integration of theory and practice**
- Our programme offers credit-bearing training on **mental health first aid** by qualified instructor(s). Students who complete the training module, which is subject to quota, can become qualified mental health first aiders, with a Certificate issued by the Mental Health Association of Hong Kong

# Programme Intended Learning Outcomes

**PILO<sub>3</sub>** **integrate** major theories/principles of positive psychology to innovatively and sensibly address real life issues and challenges in educational and community settings;

**PILO<sub>4</sub>** **evaluate** theoretical foundations and practical applications of positive psychology and positive education using rigorous scientific principles and ethical standards; and

**PILO<sub>5</sub>** **design and implement** professional, effective, and ethical positive psychology interventions and positive education programmes in local, regional, and global contexts.

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## **Participants**

- Bachelor degree holders, especially those who wish to build a career or pursue further studies in areas of psychology and education.

## **Medium of Instruction**

- The medium of instruction is English.

# Programme Structure

- The programme comprises **24 credit points (cps)**
  - **One year of full-time or Two years of part-time**
- Students are required to complete
  - **5 core courses and 3 elective courses** for graduation
  - Each course carries 3 cps
- Full-time students will attend 4 classes per week and part-time students will attend 2 classes per week. Classes in the same or different semester(s) may be scheduled on **weekday evenings** (6:30pm – 9:20pm), **weekends** and/or **during long holidays** at the Tai Po Campus / Tseung Kwan O Study Centre / North Point Study Centre / Kowloon Tong Satellite Study Centre and/or other locations as decided by the University.

# Prospects

- Provide incremental values of professional development for:
  - **Principals, teachers**, teaching assistants, and programme coordinators in kindergarten, primary, and secondary **school settings**
  - **Counsellors and social workers** in school and community settings
  - **Project and liaison officers** in public organisations, private enterprises, advocacy and social policy groups, and community **agencies that provide children and youth services**
  - **Human resources** officers and managerial staff in public and private sections that provide training and support to staff
  - **Administrators** in government, academic institutions, and non-governmental **organisations that promote mental health among general public**
- Provide a strong foundation for further studies
  - to be a **researcher or practitioner** in areas of psychology and education

# General Admission Requirements

- Applicants should hold a recognised **Bachelor's degree**.
- Applicants whose entrance qualification was obtained from an **institution in a non-English speaking system** should normally fulfil one of the following minimum English proficiency requirements:
  - IELTS 6.0; or
  - Grade C or above in GCSE / GCE OL English; or
  - TOEFL score of 80 (internet-based test); or
  - Band 6 in the Chinese Mainland's College English Test (CET) (a total score of 430 or above and the test result should be valid within two years); or
  - Other equivalent qualifications

The results of IELTS/TOEFL provided should be within two years (i.e., for the 2025/26 intake, the IELTS/TOEFL test must be obtained on or after 1 Jan 2023); and

The results of IELTS/TOEFL should be “taken in test centres” (i.e., tests taken online such as IELTS indicator/IELTS Online and TOEFL Home Editions are NOT accepted).

# Tuition Fee

- **HK\$151,200** (provisional and subject to adjustment)
- Extension fees will be charged to students who have to extend their studies beyond the normal duration (i.e. 1 year for full-time and 2 years for part-time).
