Supplement to GBA Visits

Visa Subsidy & New Mainland Travel Permit arrangement for Non-Chinese Students

- 1. Hong Kong and Macau permanent residents (Non-Chinese Citizens) students are strongly encouraged to apply for the new Mainland Travel Permit (for multiple visits) at their own expense. They will not be allowed to claim the visa application fee from the financial support from the Faculty/ University if they apply for a one-time visa. This is in line with other local Chinese students who have to pay for the 回鄉證 themselves.
- 2. Other non-local non-Mainland students, who are not permanent residents, can continue to claim the visa application fee from the overall budget of the GBA visits (i.e. \$1,500/student (capped at \$1,800)).
