Professor Keith Johnson

Keith Johnson is Emeritus Professor of Linguistics and Language Education at Lancaster University. His recent publications include *An Introduction to Foreign Language Learning and Teaching* (Second Edition, 2008), *Expertise in Second Language Learning and Teaching* (edited collection, 2005), *Designing Language Teaching Tasks* (2003), and *Language Teaching and Skill Learning* (1996). He was founding editor of the journal *Language Teaching Research*, and his main research interest in recent years has been in language teaching expertise. Before Lancaster, Keith Johnson worked at the Universities of Essex and Reading, where he was a founding member of the Centre for Applied Language Studies (CALS). He has travelled widely as lecturer and consultant.

Introspection

This workshop will concentrate on some aspects of introspection, particularly concurrent and retrospective verbalizations ('think-alouds'), including stimulated recall. Several research projects utilizing these techniques will be briefly described, but the main focus of attention will be on practical issues involved in undertaking research involving these techniques. Potential uses for these versions of introspection, plus the advantages and disadvantages of them will be considered, and this will involve participants in working with exemplars of data.
